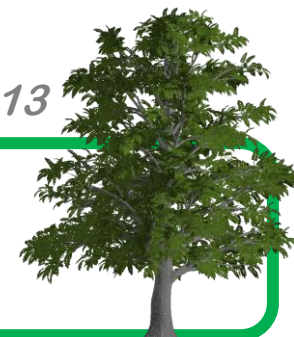

Twisted Tales - Autumn 1

The aim of this theme is to explore story telling techniques and discover how traditional tales can be rewritten, redesigned and retold with new and varied ideas.

English

As writers we will:-

- Write instructions about how to cook an omelette for a giant
- Explore descriptive sentences in SPaG
- Describe and write fact files about wolves
- Explore rhyming poetry

As readers we will:-

- Read a range of text types
- Use VIPERS to answer questions
- Continue to use our phonetic and common exception word knowledge to support our reading skills

Science and Foundation Subjects

As learners we will:-

- Science - explore how plants grow
- D& T - Cook omelettes for a giant
- Art – Explore blending paints
- Geography – local surroundings and maps
- History – learn about castles and why they appear in traditional tales
- Music – learn about the orchestra and how music can support film/the stage
- PE – learn team games
- RE – learn about Islam and accepting others
- Computing – use Purple Mash to code

Mathematics

As mathematicians we will:-

- Count forwards and backwards within 20 and 50
- Explore tens and ones
- Count and represent objects up to 100
- Use part-whole models
- Compare and order objects and numbers
- Count in 2s, 5s, 10s and 3s
- Recap over number bonds
- Add and subtract numbers (1 digit and 2 digit)
- Continue to work towards our Total Recall badge

What can I do to help my child?

2. Watch a show or a pantomime.
3. Make puppets using wooden spoons or socks and retell one of our class stories to your family.
